



- 1 Main Entrance**  
The main entrance is around 200 metres away from the airstrip

---

- 2 Bird watch towers**  
There are at least two structures that appear to be Bird watch towers not far from the compound main entrance.

---

- 3 Barracks**  
At least four structures a few meters from the main entrance appear to be military barracks. Compared to a 2012 Google Earth image, the number of the structures has significantly increased

---

- 4 Military trucks, water bowser and earthmovers**  
More than five military vehicles were captured by Satellite image stationed within and outside the compound.

---

- 5 Helipad**  
Satellite images show that a helipad was constructed as far back as 2012, contrary to claims by government that it was constructed in March 2017

---

- 6 Solar Panels**  
For power generation, it appears that the compound relies on solar panels.

---

- 7 Residential houses**  
The number of houses constructed within the compound has increased dramatically

---

- 8 Kgotla**  
A fire place can be seen in the middle of the compound

---

- 9 Power Generator**  
Near the helipad is a structure that experts believe to be a power generator

---

- 10 Store Houses or Ablution**  
Structures measuring about 3 meters by 2 metres



### Private or Public Airstrip?

“It may be further noted that the planned airstrip at Mosu will be a simple gravel runway. It is located outside of His Excellency’s compound, on public land...” Jeff Ramsay October 30, 2013
